Maritime Security

A Comprehensive Course to Increase Maritime Security and Safety

Global Risk and Resilience

This executive education course aims at offering the industry most potentially affected by threats to Maritime Security – the shipping and trading industry – a new comprehensive approach that includes cutting-edge technologies and risk analysis instruments such as Strategic Foresight.

COURSE BENEFITS

The goal of the course is to offer practical toolboxes and recommendations to stakeholders on questions such as:

- How can Strategic Foresight be used by the industry to plan for the prevention and mitigation of Maritime Security threats, and better negotiate international contracts when Geopolitical Risks on Natural Resources occur?
- What are the possible ways for a terrorist or criminal organisation to carry out disruptive attacks on the transport chain or use containers to perpetrate attacks (CBRN, explosives, cyber attacks, Transport Information Management System, etc.)?
- In which ways may recent scientific and technological developments increase the risk of attack against the transport chain? In particular, what will be the vulnerabilities of autonomous vessels?
- How can the scientific and technological developments and new procedures such as the resort to Space Capabilities (Remote Sensing, Telecommunication and Positioning Systems) be used to increase the security of the transport chain?

COURSE FOCUS

The World Economic Forum Global Risk Report 2018 identified as the top risks in terms of likelihood: extreme weather events; natural disasters; cyberattacks; data fraud or theft; failure of climate change mitigation and adaptation. All those risks can affect maritime transport security dramatically.

While global maritime traffic regularly increases, so do scientific and technological developments (such as satellite imagery, artificial intelligence, or Strategic Foresight) to assess the risks to Maritime Security, prevent them, or mitigate their consequences.

In this new course, specific and practical recommendations will be addressed to the relevant stakeholders on policy, regulatory frameworks, use of new technologies, training of personnel, etc. for risk assessment, risk reduction/mitigation, improved prevention, and response to attempted attacks to Maritime Security.
