Geopolitics and Global Futures

Course dates: 12 June - 14 June 2019

Course location: Geneva, Switzerland The course reflects the programme's aims of examining the multiple dimensions of global security, identifying and analysing transformative technologies, and using insights from neuroscience to further our understanding of international affairs. The course's fundamental premise is that we need new paradigms to understand, prepare for and respond to current and future global challenges.

COURSE BENEFITS

This three-day course organised by the Geopolitics and Global Futures Programme will address a number of key themes in global security.

As a participant, you will:

- develop your knowledge around a broad range of security issues
- gain a comprehensive understanding of some of the most significant technological developments over the coming decades
- be equipped with the critical and analytical skills to address the implications of these trends

COURSE FOCUS:

The course is structured around three major topics in the international security field.

- Day 1 will cover outer space security, multilateral space governance, and both the traditional and emerging actors in this field.
- Day 2 will explore transformative technologies, their security ramifications, and the ethical challenges that they pose.
- Day 3 will be dedicated to the neurophilosophy of global security, examining how recent developments in neuroscience shed light on human nature, and can help us to better comprehend individual and state behaviour.

The three modules of the course can be followed separately or together.





Course Director

Professor Nayef Al-Rodhan is a Philosopher, Neuroscientist and Geostrategist. He is Head of GCSP's Geopolitics and Global Futures Programme and Honorary Fellow of St. Antony's College at the University of Oxford, United Kingdom. He holds an M.D. and a Ph.D. He trained in neurosurgery/ neuroscience research at the Mayo Clinic, Yale University and Harvard University.

Expert Educators

Our educators include the GCSP's own international team composed of academics and practitioners with broad experience in security policy, diplomacy and/ or military affairs, as well as guest speakers who are government officials, military officers, representatives from international institutions and civil society, academics and researchers.
