COURSE BENEFITS

This course will enable you to:

- gain insight into the component elements and root causes of violent extremism, identifying the key groups promoting violent radicalisation;
- formulate a better understanding of the global P/CVE agenda including the UN's expanded normative and programmatic role in this area;
- greater understanding of the P/CVE stakeholders and the role they play (emphasis on civil society organisations, gender and youth);
- track the evolution of the methods and communications strategies used to promote violent extremist ideologies (with a focus on technology):
- greater consciousness in "what works and what doesn't work" to build resilience against violent extremism;
- learning how to formulate a strategy for a national action to prevent and counter violent extremism including design, formulation and implementation practices;
- access to our PVE Online Platform created by the Swiss Confederation and the GCSP that identifies contextualized and conflict-sensitive research on the drivers of violent extremism;
- exchange views with peers and experienced experts and practitioners in a neutral and open environment.

This course offers a unique opportunity to unpack the process of formulating a strategy for preventing and countering violent extremism. It examines the implications of UN Security Council Resolution 2178 for those involved in developing national plans. It helps build an understanding of the global community of P/CVE stakeholders and their roles at both the national, regional and international level.

The course offers an overview of the current global threat of terrorism focusing on the factors of violent extremism as well as the most effective methods used to prevent violent extremism.

COURSE FOCUS:

The course is a combination of presentations from noted practitioners and experts in the field. The course participants will be asked to do group work. Throughout the course, there are ample opportunities to share best practices and ideas among experts and participants.

The course advances participants' potential effectiveness in five areas:

- Analysis
- Measurement
- Planning
- Implementation
- Knowledge sharing

Dr Christina Schori Liang is a Senior Programme Advisor and Senior Fellow in the Emerging Security Challenges Programme at the GCSP.
