Thematic cluster: Diplomatic Tradecraft

Course dates: 10 - 12 June 2020

Course location: Geneva, Switzerland Political advisors are instrumental in the decisionmaking processes of peace and security. Their effectiveness is of fundamental importance both on the ground and at an international level. Their duties require them to synthesise information rapidly, to develop a comprehensive understanding of the context and key issues at hand, and to convey that understanding and analysis to their institutions at varying levels, while building and nurturing meaningful relationships. This course builds the skill sets and networks that political advisors need to carry out their work more efficiently and effectively.

COURSE FOCUS:

The course is the opportunity to sharpen skills and acquire knowledge through an intensive hands-on curriculum under the mentorship of expert educators. Substantive inputs are followed by group work on case studies, providing valuable learning opportunities through exchanges between participants – all experienced professionals – and the course leaders, who serve as mentors.
