- expand cross-cultural understandings and instil a greater awareness of gender considerations


COURSE FOCUS:

She has experience in facilitating trainings on dealing with the past and providing support to actors in the field, such as the Truth and Dignity Commission in Tunisia. Previously, Julie worked at the Khmer Rouge Tribunal in Cambodia.

International participants should be affiliated with: Government ministries, organisations and institutions, non-governmental organisations or traditional authorities, active in the field of peacebuilding.

The costs of the course are covered by the Swiss FDFA, the GCSP, and the Swiss Armed Forces. Participants or their sending institutions are required to cover travel costs to Switzerland.

Swiss Expert Pool for Civilian Peacebuilding **Background**

The Swiss Expert Pool for Civilian Peacebuilding (SEP) aims to reinforce Swiss foreign and security policy in the area of international peacebuilding. Each year, approximately 200 people - about 70 at any given time on average – are deployed in the field. The SEP is composed of volunteers and provides experienced personnel for both bilateral and multilateral missions. Members of the SEP are deployed through a rapidresponse mechanism to assist in areas such as human rights, democratisation, the rule of law, election support and security sector reform.


